TRANSPORTATION

As home of the nation's first site for construction of the Interstate Highway System, the St. Louis area is most easily accessible via car. However, even without a vehicle, there are other options for reaching your destination.

Metro (metrostlouis.org)

Public transit is available across the region with MetroLink light-rail service. With more than 30 stations on Red and Blue lines, the MetroLink touches many St. Louis neighborhoods. When combined with MetroBus service, routes extend west to connect with the rest of the county.

RideFinders (sharetheridestl.org)

Save money and the environment with the regional commuter rideshare program. With carpools and vanpools available, commuters can get to and from work alongside others who share a similiar route as yours.

Bike Routes (stlouis-mo.gov)

Riding a bike is popular in many parts of the city, with multi-use and protected bike lanes on several roadways. Greenway trails are also available inside and outisde the city limits and connect wider parts of the region.

MONUMENTS & HISTORICAL SITES

Gateway Arch (gatewayarch.com)

America's tallest man-made monument at 630 feet represents the city's historical importance as the Gateway to the West.

Old Courthouse (nps.gov/jeff/planyourvisit/och.htm)

One of St. Louis' most prominent architectural landmarks and the visitor's center for the Gateway Arch is the site of the landmark Dred Scott case.

P A R K S

Forest Park (forestparkforever.org)

Site of the 1904 World's Fair and one of the largest urban parks in the country, Forest Park features an outdoor theatre, golf course, jogging trails, skating rink and lakes.

Missouri Botanical Garden (missouribotanicalgarden.org)

Founded in 1859, the nation's oldest botanical garden in continuous operation is a National Historic Landmark and offers 79 acres of scenic landscaping, including a tropical rain forest, Japanese strolling garden, and one of the world's largest collections of rare and endangered orchids.
